# The Andhra Pradesh State Coop. Bank Ltd., Vijayawada PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE LEVEL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE (SLTC) MEETING HELD ON 07.03.2022

The State Level Technical Committee (SLTC) meeting was held on 07.03.2022 at 04:00 P.M., in the Secretariat, Velagapudi, Amaravathi to review and finalize the Scales of Finance (SoF) for various crops for the year 2022-23. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Poonam Malakondaiah, IAS, Spl. Chief Secretary to Government, Agriculture Department, Govt. of A.P. Sri Y Madhusudhan Reddy, Principal Secretary to Government, Marketing & Cooperation, Govt. of A.P., and representatives from the offices of SLBC, NABARD, Departments of Agriculture, Horticulture, Sericulture, Fisheries, Sugars; Senior Officers from SBI, Indian Bank, Chaitanya Godavari Grameena Bank and APCOB have taken part in the meeting. The list of participants is enclosed as Annexure.

The Managing Director, APCOB/ Convener, SLTC welcomed all the participants to the meeting. The Convener, SLTC explained the steps/procedure involved in fixation of the Scales of Finance and role of SLTC in the process and requested all the members to share their views, make suggestions in moderating the Scales of Finance fixed by the DLTCs (District Level Technical Committees) of the districts.

The Scales of Finance suggested by the 13 DLTCs for the year 2022-23 were reviewed in detail for each of the irrigated and un-irrigated crops, both Khariff 2021 and Rabi 2021-22 district-wise, fixed by the DLTCs concerned. After having detailed deliberations on the costs involved in raising crops and gross value of yield etc., and the recommendations of the DLTCs, realistic scales of finance were arrived by the SLTC for the year 2022-23 as follows:
