PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE LEVEL TECHNICAL COMMITTEE (SLTC)  
MEETING FOR F.Y. 2023-24 HELD ON **20.03.2023**

The State Level Technical Committee (SLTC) meeting was held on 20.03.2023 at 04:00 P.M., in the **Conference Hall, Agriculture Department Office, IHC Corporate Building, Mangalagiri** to review and finalize the Scales of Finance (SoF) for various crops for the year **2023-24**. The meeting was chaired by Sri Gopal Krishna Dwivedi, IAS, Spl. Chief Secretary, Agri., GoAP., Sri A. Babu, IAS CC&RCS, GoAP., Sri C Hari Kiran, Commissioner of Agriculture GoAP., Sri Dr. S.S. Sridhar, Commissioner of Horticulture, Sri Dr. R S Reddy, MD, APCOB and representatives from the offices of SLBC, NABARD, Departments of Agriculture, Horticulture, Sericulture, Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, Sugar & Cane; Senior Officers from SBI, Indian Bank, Chaitanya Godavari Grameena Bank, Saptagiri Grameena Bank and APCOB have taken part in the meeting.

The list of participants is enclosed as Annexure.

The Managing Director, APCOB/ Convener, SLTC welcomed all the participants to the meeting. The Convener, SLTC explained the steps/procedure involved in fixation of the Scales of Finance and role of SLTC in the process and requested all the members to share their views, make suggestions in moderating the Scales of Finance fixed by the DLTCs (District Level Technical Committees) of the districts.

The Scales of Finance suggested by the 26 DLTCs for the year 2023-24 were reviewed in detail for each of the irrigated and un-irrigated crops, both Khariff 2023 and Rabi 2023-24 district-wise, fixed by the DLTCs concerned. After having detailed deliberations on the costs involved in raising crops and gross value of yield etc., and the recommendations of the DLTCs, realistic scales of finance were arrived by the SLTC for the year 2023-24 as follows:

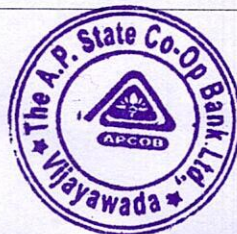
